FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK BY JIM MARLETT


The 2023 Wichita Train Show and Swap Meet, also known as the "Best Train Show in Wichita," is in the books. But there was also the Model Train Convention and Expo in McPherson, where the Chisholm Trail Modular Group debuted the new modular layout. So this will be the train show issue of Trails, Rails, & Tails.

I thought I'd put in a plug for NMRA's Special Interest Groups (SIGs). I've enjoyed the process of planning my railroad and look forward to operating it, so I decided to join the SIGs related to those functions – the Layout Design SIG (LDSIG) and the Operations SIG (OpsSIG). Both of them have websites that are full of useful information. Much of the content is members only, but there is also info available to anyone. Not much has happened in my own basement. I did finally come up with a plan for my final town of Blakely, Colorado. There are still a few tweaks I'd like to make, but that can come with the actual construction. Most of the last two months of model railroading came in the form track planning, preparing to give a clinic, dealing with a broken dishwasher and being sick. Those last ones didn't have much to do with model railroading except to impede it.

All that being said, it really is time to start building the layout again. I need to buy some 3/4" plywood though, and that has me stymied. I had aways planned to use table-top construction on this last phase and those tables would be topped with Baltic birch plywood. It's the finest, straightest, most stable, self supporting plywood you can buy. It has been absolutely trouble free where I've used it before. Unfortunately, most of it is manufactured in Russia and that makes it hard to get right now. It is still available at one local supplier (special ordered, of course), but the price for a 4x8" sheet is now up to a penny shy of \$170. I need at least two sheets to finish my railroad and probably three. My wife has suggested that I could use a less perfect plywood. She's probably right, but I'm waffling in indecision again. We'll see what choice I made in the next issue of Trails, Rails, and Tales.






CHISHOLM TRAIL MODULAR LAYOUT DEBUT AT MCPERSON MODEL TRAIN CONVENTION AND EXPO


