







## Editor's Musings

We truly have been living in trying times, but we might be seeing the light at the end of the tunnel and hopefully it's not the 3:10 from Yuma. Although many of the year's early train shows have been cancelled, the **Boot Hill Model Railroad Club** is hosting a Train Show in Garden City, KS. This month on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> at the Fairgrounds.



For the first time this year, the Western Kansas Division's WKR Layout (left) is being disassembled, packed-up, loaded- up, and will head off to a train show.

The 18-foot by 24-foot layout breaks down into two corner pairs and six straight section pairs.

The first order of business was to open up the LTV (Layout Transport Vehicle), and sweep it out (right). We'll break down the layout and get everything packed prior to loading as several boxes of structures fit into shelves which are later blocked by the layout, so they go in first.






The first step in breaking down the layout is to remove all the trains and pack them up. (Left) All the rolling stock fits into two cardboard carrying boxes and the hard-shell case protects the locomotives with interior foam cushioning plus we pack the Operations Manual for operating sessions.

It's not likely to be a big show, or even highly attended as many exhibitors and spectators have concerns for their health, but I am going, we will run trains, hold operating sessions, and have as much fun as allowed.





## WKR Layout Update



(Right) I decided to use most of the last sets of Fox Valley wheel sets for the project, so the Micro-Trains trucks were removed, the original plastic wheels were removed and replaced by the new metal wheel sets. The WKR has a standard that all wheels are painted "Rust", so the wheel fronts and backs were painted as well as the truck side frames, then re-installed. (Left) I decided to up-grade four of my Con-Cor autoracks with additional weight and metal wheel sets.

The group had already been upgraded to Micro-Trains wheel sets and couplers years ago, but the metal wheels greatly reduce the rolling resistance (below).






(Left) The final step was to pop the roof section off, then add two ¼-ounce weights over the truck bolsters for a total addition of ½-ounce.

(Right) Work progressed a bit on the addition of streetlights to sections 14 and 1. The first Miller Engineering power distribution block has been wired with the required resistors. Shrink tubing was applied to the block side of the resistor, then the wire was bent to shape and screwed to the terminal. This distribution block will allow ten streetlights which is the correct amount for section 14. Work is suspended until after the Garden City Train Show.



Welcome to a sneak peek of the *Deep River Southern*, a supurb N-scale layout that is just one of the possible layouts to visit and operate during the Tulsa Union Convention this October In Tulsa, Oklahoma.



From the Layout Design & Operations Weekend Timetable, Dave Salamon describes his layout: "The **Deep River Southern** is a freelanced N-scale layout set in 1958. It has been featured in several issues of *N Scale Magazine* and the *Cowcatcher Roundup*. The layout is a multiple level layout with the mainline making up the lower main level and the Branch line on the upper level."



From the Timetable: "On the mainline level the layout features the large town of Beckton which has a classification yard, engine servicing facilities for both steam and diesel, and several industries that are served. Eastridge Staging is located below Beckton and is accessed by a 4-turn helix. The next town on the layout is Green Valley and contains several grain elevators and other industries to support the local farmers and an interchange with the Frisco with a hand operated smash board where the two railroads cross along with a scale house that is used to weigh all grain cars. Port Allen is my tribute to John Allen, it has no resemblance to any location that was on his layout, but I do have a car float operation and other switching opportunities. The last main line town on the layout is Clifton, which serves



mines and mills and the spur to the dam site. The layout then continues into the closet where Davis Junction is located, this is where the branch line connects with the mainline."

Continuing from the Timetable: "Just past Davis Junction is the western terminus of the railroad where Westey Staging is located. At Davis Junction the branch line goes through the wall onto an elevator which connects the two levels. The elevator is an Armstrong type elevator, meaning completely manual, after your train gets on it you manually move it to the up or down position. When the elevator is secured in the up position the train goes back into the closet



across from Montray Pass. A short while later your train enters back into the main room and is at the large cement plant, the Calaveras Cement – Hastings Plant, this plant hosts its own switcher. As the branch line continues down the back wall it enters the end of the line at Pine Flat Logging Company. Also Pine Flat is known not only for the lumber industry but for the many packing plants located there. The two railroads share the wye. The PFLC has a large sawmill, log pond, engine house and small yard, as the train leaves the yard they cross over the famous Dinkey Creek bridge and around the milliondollar cut and enters Camp 9, the logging line continues into the woods to additional camps."






Continuing from the Timetable: "Current operations include a Yardmaster that classifies the inbound trains, builds outbound trains and switches the local industries in Beckton.


There are two operators which run local trains, passenger trains, through trains and interchange trains. There is also a Branch line operator who runs the branch line, cement plant and logging line."








(Above) A look at the manual elevator in the up position.



"The layout is wired for DC control, and all throttles have walk-around memory. Turnouts on the layout are controlled by manual choke cables, with control panels located above the town for power assignments. The layout is operated using car cards. A big Thank You to Dave Salamon for a fun weekend."




