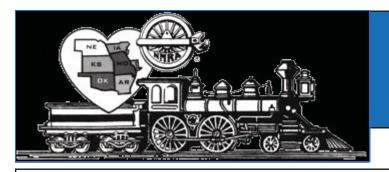

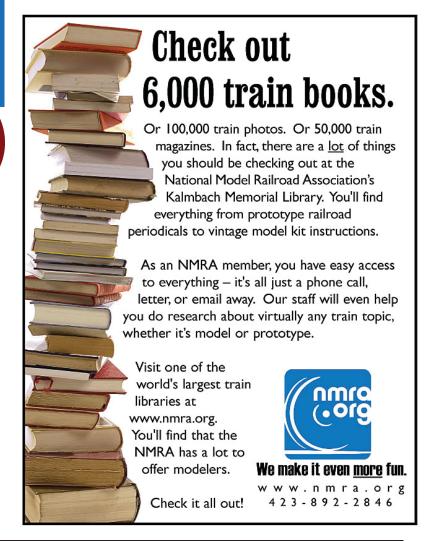

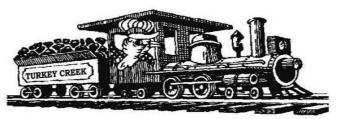

Kansas Division of the Missouri Pacific **Original Concept** By Robert A Simmons

Being born and raised in St. Louis, then settling in Western Kansas, I wanted a model railroadthat reflected both my

Proto-Lance

The only problem I had with choosing the Missouri Pacific, was that as of 1982 it became part of the Union Pacific, and no longer has a separate identity. I solved that by becoming a "Proto-Lance" modeler, where I combine the prototype heritage, with my own vision of the present and future (freelance). In this case, I de

was a more profitable road. Proto-lancing also allows me to add all the other roads the UP adsorbed into the "New" MoPac. I also deviated from history by deciding to double track the main line in Kansas.

Breaking the Circle

As a boy, I learned with my first layout, that you can only watch a train go around

It's Fall, and the Milo pile just keeps getting bigger! A pair of MP AC4400's and a newer Southern Pacific heritage unit switch the Wind River Co-Op elevator.

Missouri heritage as well as my Kansas future. St. Louis was the corporate headquarters of the Missouri Pacific, and the Kansas Division of the Western District passed through Kansas on it's way to Pueblo (in fact, the old MoPac main line is only 30-minutes North of my home). I chose to model the MoPac from

cided that when the merger took place, the MoPac became the dominate partner and adsorbed the UP. This isn't as wild as it sounds, at the time of the merger the MoPac had a maior North-South corridor from Chicago to the Gulf Coast and Mexico, had a larger and more modern locomotive fleet, and

in a circle so many times. It took me a long time to figure out how to simulate railroading with a folded dog bone layout. Then it struck me, just because buildings are grouped together to visually form a town or City, doesn't mean each building can't represent a different location! To add a touch of realism, I scanned the Yellow Pages, and pulled names and log-

Tribune, KS. To Kansas City, MO. This layout attempts to get the general flavor of Western Kansas, but I have not attempted to duplicate actual MoPac scenes, that's for the next layout. I quickly decided on the modern era, as I fell in love with large, powerful, locos and long trains.

One of my personal favorites, and one of the most commented about at train shows is this Tomix depressed-center flat car with load.

During a HO operating session, one of my locos blew an armature wire and was replaced. The Athearn motor then became a N scale generator load.

os from businesses that matched my chosen industries. At a recent train show, a man admired my N-Trak layout, then approached me, showed me his business card, and told me that he was the owner of one of my industries. He was pleased to have a little free advertising, and agreed to let me model some of his trucks. In an effort to simulate time and distance, each crew does two laps, performs the required movement, does two more laps, then looks for the next assignment. To keep time on track, I have incorporated a 6:1 fast clock (10-minutes equals 1-hour), and to add spice, "Chance" cards are drawn occasionally to change the situation from normal. These can be serious, such as a hot box detection on a piece of rolling stock that must be set out at the nearest siding, to the whimsical, "You forgot your sunglasses in the car. You must squint for the remainder of the session."

Operations

Years ago, I stumbled across Albion Software's "Ship It!". Although it is very complex, it does make you think like a real railroad. I have a dedicated computer that runs the "Ship It!" program and generates all operating sessions. For many years, I ran operating sessions nightly by myself. Using the double track main, I would engineer one train, and allow the second to "orbit" to simulate multiple train traffic, then switch back and forth. Recently I decided to work towards the NMRA Chief Dispatcher award, so I am hosting bi-weekly operating sessions with other Club members. There are twelve possible industries to switch each session, and thanks to "Ship It!", each session is different. By varying load requests, and length of time it takes to load/unload shipments, a few industries are served daily, some others may be three, seven, or even ten days. "Ship It!" also allows "beyond the layout" staging, by running trains in adjoining Divisions to simulate traffic off the layout. For example, the Wheatland Electric power plant in Scott City receives a load of coal from an interchange connection in Colorado which I don't model on the layout. The loads are picked-up in the yard in Tribune, delivered to Scott City, and the empties returned in kind. I have some types of cars that are never delivered on the layout, they simply pass through occasionally. In the Western District of the "New" MoPac, Eastbound traffic originates at Mile High Yard in Denver, and runs to Tribune, Kansas for a crew change. Then it's on the Neff Yard in Kansas City, Missouri for another crew



change, before heading to Gateway Yard in St. Louis, Missouri. The Westbound trains are a reverse mirror image.

The Layout

When we purchased our home in 1992, I discovered a basement utility room that was 24' x 11', and had a set of four shelves along two of the walls in a "L" shape. I noticed that the third shelf was just about the right height for a layout, so I removed the third shelf, and started building bench work in its place. The end result is a "U" shaped folded dog bone

layout that measures 17' x 11' x 15' and varies between 2' and 4' in width. It is double track main with thirty-eight scratch-built track switches, some of which are high-speed #12's, and others custom curved. Control is DCC by Digitrax with DT- 400 throttles.

These trucks are all white metal castings kits made by Wiseman Model Services (formerly Scale Structures Ltd.). I find the kits to be of good quality and the parts need only a small amount of cleanup. I use 5 minutes epoxy and ACC to assemble the models. I don't always use every part such as underbody suspension, if it is not going to be seen or important to the detail of a scene. Paint is air brushed Floquil & Model Master with airbrushed rust, etc., and chalk to further weather. I always use "clear Elmer's School Glue" to make window glass. I also add clear jewels as headlights. I feel painting the wheels a different color adds visual interest and was prototypical per some old photos.

RAILROADS and DEPOTS DIXON COUNTY, NEBRASKA By Jim van Delden, Cowboy Line Division

Exciting events took place in the early part of the 19^{th} century as the growing

nation extended westward. President Jefferson and Congress authorized the acquisition of a vast tract of land west of the Missouri River. Lands appropriated by the French from the indigenous peoples now became available to the fledgling republic and was called the Louisiana Purchase. Exploration of this territory rested on the shoulders of Merriwether Captains and William Lewis Clark. Their Corps of Discovery traced the Missouri River to its origins and the exploreventually ers reached the Pacific Ocean during their epic voyage in the years 1804-1806. Paddling upstream from St Lou-

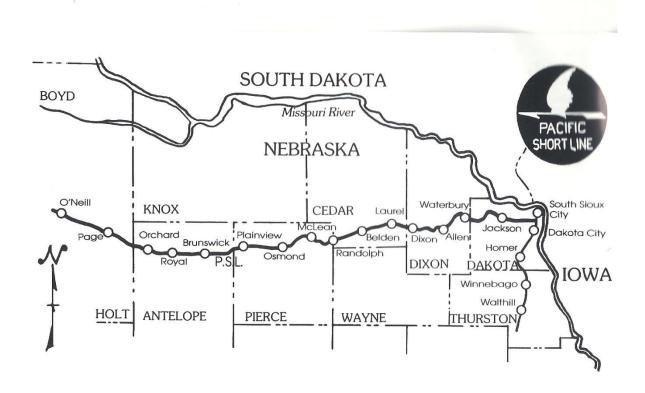
is, they were to pass the early settlements that eventually became Omaha, Nebraska and Sioux City, Iowa.

Fast forward some five decades later, with the Civil War pitting the North against the South, President Lincoln signed the Pacific Railroad Act of 1862. This empowered the nation to offer incentives and payment for the construction of a transcontinental railroad that would connect the East and West coasts with a twin ribbon of steel. The Central Pacific started construction in an eastward direction in 1863 and the Union Pacific followed by heading westward in 1865. A combined 1776 rail miles later, the two companies would meet at Promontory Point, Utah in 1869.

The initial Pacific Railroad Act of 1861, called for three rail lines that would eventually merge near North Platte, Nebraska,

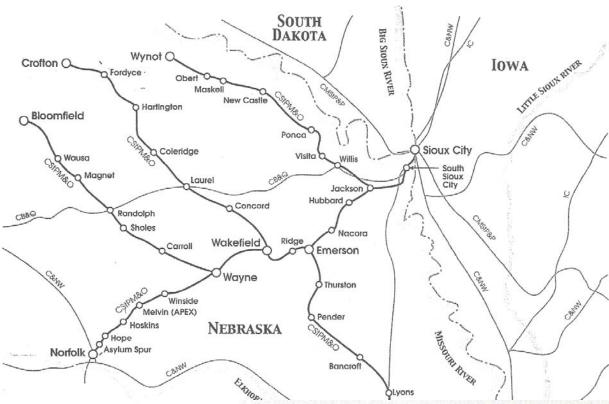
and continue as the Transcontinental Railroad. One of these was to go through Sioux City, Iowa, but these plans were revised, and the eastern terminus was subsequently located in Council Bluffs/Omaha. By 1868, The Sioux City and Pacific Railroad made its local debut. The Illinois Central followed soon and so did the Sioux City and St Paul Railroad. The latter was joined by other smaller companies and in time became the Chicago, St Paul, Minneapolis and Omaha Railway, known later as the Omaha Road. Growing in population and the mushrooming of the meatpacking industries, Sioux City, Iowa, was entertaining plans for constructing a railway all the way west to Salt Lake City, Utah, for distribution of meat products.

The Pacific Short Line became the name of this proposed railroad and it was to be built in three segments. Local interests were to construct the Nebraska and Western Railway Company from Covington (early name of South Sioux City), Nebraska, across the northern portion of the state to the Wyoming state line. The second portion of the line through



Wyoming would be the responsibility of the Wyoming and Eastern Railway Company. From the Utah/Wyoming border, the Salt Lake Valley and Eastern Railway would then complete the Pacific Short Line into Salt Lake City. In mid 1890, the initial portion of the line, 128 miles, was completed into O'Neill, Nebraska. Due to financial difficulties, no further construction was accomplished. The segments in Wyoming and Utah were never begun. The Nebraska and Western Railway became the Sioux City, O'Neill, and Western Railway Company in 1891, and by 1899, following additional legal maneuvering, it changed into the Sioux City and Western, and eventually became a part of James Hill's Great Northern Railway. By 1907, an operating agreement assigned the Sioux City and Western to be part of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad. The line coursed through Dixon County and called on three depots in the communities of Waterbury, Allen, and Dixon.

Gold was discovered in South Dakota's Black Hills by the mid 1870's and this fueled desires for additional rail transportation west from Sioux City, Iowa. Dixon County in northeastern Nebraska became a partner in building the narrow gauge Covington, Columbus, and Black Hills Railroad from Coburn Junction just west of South Sioux City, Nebraska all the way to Ponca, situated in northern Dixon County on the Missouri River. By 1876, Nebraska's only narrow gauge railroad was functioning but soon it became evident that it was not a profitable business. The shipping of grain, cattle and hogs from Ponca eastward necessitated off-loading and re-loading the freight on standard gauge equipment on arrival in Sioux City. Also, fraudulent practices by the Covington, Columbus and Black Hills Railroad's management such as not paying their workers did not



braska Western Railway was the only one completed was known in later years as the Sioux City, O'Neill and Western Railway, and still later as the Sioux City and Western. 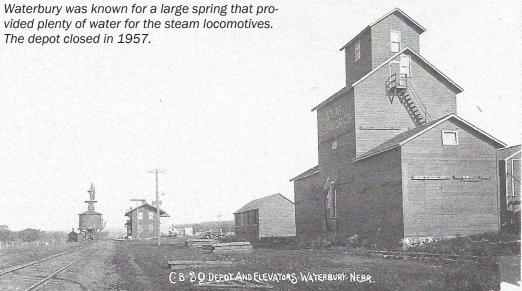
Waterbury was known for a large spring that provided plenty of water for the steam locomotives. The depot closed in 1957.

endear the railroad to the general public. Bankruptcy and receivership soon followed and Dixon County lost out on their investment. The Chicago, St Paul, Minneapolis and Omaha Railroad acquired the property and rebuilt the narrow gauge into a standard gauge line. Additional construction extended the line to Newcastle and Maskell, with both communities situated in the northern part of Dixon County. The Omaha Road, later absorbed by the Chicago and North Western stopped at depots in Ponca, Newcastle, and Maskell until its demise.

In 1869, the Omaha and North Western Railroad incorporated in Omaha. It planned to construct a railroad from

Omaha in a northwesterly direction through Blair, Nebraska, towards the Niobrara River as it emptied into the Missouri River. The O&NW connected with the Sioux City and Pacific Railroad. The latter originated in Sioux City, Iowa, and trains headed southward to the Missouri Valley area, then turned west across the Missouri River. From Blair northward, passengers and freight both continued the journey through such towns as Herman, Tekamah, Oakland, Pender, eventually reaching the Dixon County community of Emerson. Previously known as Kenesaw Junction, Emerson was a busy junction town as it received and dispatched trains westward to Norfolk, Nebraska. Rail traffic also came and left in an easterly direction for Sioux City, Iowa. Heading in a southerly direction, one eventually reached Omaha, Nebraska. From Emerson, one could reach the depots in Wakefield and Concord, the other towns in Dixon County on the Chicago, St Paul, Minneapolis, and Omaha Railroad.

The Pacific Short Line whose eastern portion known as the Ne-

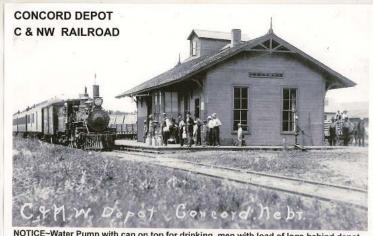

Kenesaw Junction as it was known earlier, Emerson was a busy junction town with rail traffic from three different directions.



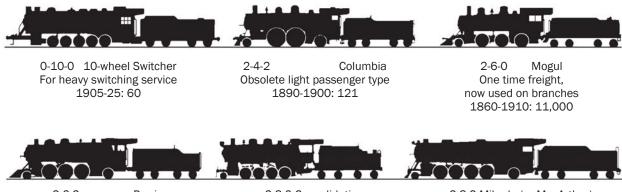

NMRA Data Sheets Program

The NMRA Data Sheets are intended to be a resource for modelers. They comprise a collection of information on General Modeling, Scenery, Trackwork, Motive Power, Rolling Stock, Structures, Electrical Work, Operations, and Prototype Information. The Data Sheets are available on the new Members-Only section of the NMRA website at http://www.nmra.org/member/.

For example, from D9a.1 – Classification of Locomotives, Steam Type:



Rare, light freight type 1901-10: 1,700

2-8-0 Consolidation For way freights and heavy switching 1866-1916: 33,000

2-8-2 Mikado (or MacArthur) Most used freight type 1905-30: 14,000

However, many of the Data Sheets are out of date, having been originally prepared in the 1940s, 1950s, and 1960s. Most have only received cosmetic updates. For example, Data Sheet D4g (Diesel-Electric Locomotive Specifications) was first issued in April of 1960. It doesn't include data on any locomotive much newer than a GP-9.

I and Van Fehr of Connecticut. the NMRA Data Sheets Assistant Manager, along with Tony Koester, the Exalted Grand Poobah of the Data Sheets Revitalization Project, are currently engaged in efforts to bring the Data Sheets up to date and to add new data sheets to provide even more information to support your modeling.

We've already added four new Data Sheets which were published in the NMRA Magazine, two of which are now on the website as well:

- Alco HH-Series Switchers by Jerry T. Moyers (11/2009 issue also on the website)
- Monon 42-Foot Gondola by Mont Switzer (1/2010 issue)
- One Room Milk House by Mont Switzer (3/2010 issue - also on the)website)

Alco S-Series Switchers by Jerry T. Moyers (2/2011 issue)

Meanwhile, we're also working on the following three tasks:

1. Perform a survey, by sections, of the existing Data Sheets to determine revision needs and set priorities, and to assess the need for

new and additional sheets.

2. Assemble a database of existing and potential Data Sheet authors. Assemble a peer review committee to check proposed Data Sheets before publication.

When we've completed those three tasks, we'll be ready to start work on revising and updating the existing Data Sheets and adding more new ones as well.

Watch this space, as well as the NMRA Magazine, for further developments as we go along.

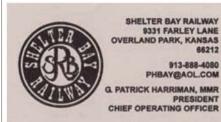
