

Not only were there a large number of layouts on exhibit, but the quality of the modeling was also exceptional, as the rare air of the mountains must activate the modeling gene.














The Rocky Mountain Region of the NMRA was well represented by the Pike's Peak Division, and their eye-catching HOscale layout



































With all the train shows in the recent past, it was hard to make additions to the layout. The scenery crew finally



got busy making street signs for the City scenes. New signs were made for Home Depot, Western State Bank, Dairy Queen, and Denny's. The signs themselves were scratch-built from 0.30 sheet styrene while the poles are aluminum tubing. The Shell sign on module 8 had been broken during transport, and it was repaired with 0.60 styrene legs. Now, all the businesses on module 1 have signs, with just a couple on module 14 left to go.


The Real Deal
