

On The Cover: New additions to the *Western Kansas Rails* fleet from the recent Garden City Train Show being upgraded to WKR specs.

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



In 2011 Midwest Model Railroad started with the idea of making this hobby more accessible to everyone. Since day one we have striven to keep our operating costs to a bare minimum and pass on those savings to you, the hobby's best customers.

As of 2022 we are succeeding in offering some of the best prices anywhere in the hobby. Some great side effects of this goal have been the creation of real-time inventory on our website and a turnaround time of just one day between purchase and shipping.

In fall 2020 we moved to a new 9,000sqft location in Independence Missouri that serves as both our retail location and our shipping facility.

Then in summer 2021 we expanded even more acquiring an additional 6,000sqft, bringing our total to 15,000sqft of model railroad product, slot cars, board games, and more. Our central location near Kansas City, MO means orders can get to any corner of the United States, usually arriving within just a few days.

As of this writing, I have turned the corner on recovery an by April should be a lot closer to normal. Thank you all for your prayers.



Make N-scale rolling stock perform and look better

(Left) Having visited the Garden City Train Show in March, the WKR Purchasing Department acquired a few new additions to the fleet.


The latest rolling stock from the manufacturers are good performers right out-of-the-box, and are quite detailed, however the Car Department of the WKR has set some higher standards as cars uncoupling or derailing during operating sessions totally sucks the fun out of the session.

To make it onto the WKR property, new additions must have three things: first, they must come with or be upgraded to Micro-Trains trucks and couplers, second, whether body mounted or not, the coupler box must be painted the car body color, and third, all wheels must be or upgraded to ESM (Eastern Seaboard Models) metal wheels. A fourth requirement if available is to increase the car weight (some cars are sealed from the factory). In the picture above, the white ADM car is from Atlas, and the other three are from Athearn.

(Right) All four of the new cars had removeable roofs, so it is a simple matter to add additional weight to the cars. In this case, the cars were already well weighted from the factory, but the Car Department used some small fishing weights in the bottom (to keep the center of



gravity as low as possible) and used Tacky Glue to keep them in place. While the glue is drying, they moved on to the next upgrade.



(Left) All of the factory trucks were removed, and replaced with new Micro-Trains trucks/couplers. Step one required the coupler boxes to be painted body color. The Department has acquired a good selection of water-based craft paints which allows simple colors like black or white to go right on. Sometimes the craft paints will perfectly match the body color right from the bottle, and other times we mix a custom color such as the blue and red colors shown.

(Left) A closer view of the modified trucks. We use cooking skewers to hold the truck in place while painting. The coupler boxes are painted body color. The "bottom" wheel sets are added to keep the ends of the trucks off the mat, then the coupler and truck side frames are painted "Rust" color. The "top" wheel sets are added and we decided on Micro-Mark "Railroad Tie Brown" as a good match for the dark rust color of wheels, so the front and back of each wheel is painted as well as the axles. We paint the wheels in the truck as it allows us to spin the wheel during painting to get complete coverage. Now they are ready to install.





The Friends of the Burlington Northern Railroad (FOBNR) historical society was chartered to gather, preserve, and share information about the history and the current operations of the Burlington Northern Railroad.

The group began with about 140 members absorbed from the Burlington Northern Historical Society; an unincorporated interim organization interested in studying the history of the Burlington Northern Railroad.



In 1996, following the merger between Burlington Northern and Santa Fe, the group voted to follow the Burlington Northern from 1970 to 1995 and the BNSF from 1995 to the present. Then in 2018 we added coverage of the Montana Rail Link.



The Group's quarterly publication, *The BN Expediter*, is the voice of the organization that shares news about the group's activities, BN historical data, and current operations of the railroad. It is a 24-page all-color publication and will grow even larger as the society grows and more members contribute more information.

The society also has an annual convention at some location on the BNSF system with programs, tours, displays, a banquet with a keynote speaker, and a business meeting.







ALCO RS-27




The **ALCO RS-27** (specification DL-640) is a diesel-electric locomotive built by **ALCO** between December 1959 and October 1962. Only 27 examples were manufactured. With ALCO's introduction of the Century Series line, the C-424 replaced the RS-27 in the builder's catalog. Today, the Minnesota Commercial Railway has the only two RS-27s left in existence, both operational.



Although I was still feeling weak after my ordeal, I managed to make the trip over to Garden City and take a few pictures of the event.









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
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
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The Union Pacific Historical Society!





WKR Update



(Above) The appearance of Missouri Pacific 5010, an EMD SD50 in N-scale from Atlas.

Recently The Purchasing Department of the WKR acquired a pair of pre-owned Atlas SD50 units to add some motive power to the DC only fleet. Both performed as new right out of the box and both already had Micro-Trains couplers. All they needed was a bit of touch-up as they will eventually be folded into the MPLX lease fleet.



(Above) A in-progress shot after the body shell was removed. At this point the couplers were painted "rust" color, and the grills were all "blacked for depth" before clean-up.

The method used by the Car Department to black the grills is to make a wash of black craft paint. We use a dish with a small dab of paint and a small bit of water. We then use the paint brush to quickly mix a bit at a time using more paint or more water to get the correct consistency. The wash is then applied to the grill areas then the body shell is set aside to dry. Once the wash has dried, a regular eraser on the end of a pencil is used (the pencil acts as a holder and is easier to control) to rub off the wash from the outer grills and any mistakes. This makes the painted grill ribs reappear and leaves the wash in the crevice's creating the illusion of depth. On this model the wash was applied to all the side grills, upper radiator/dynamic brake fans and exhaust port. After using the eraser, you will need to use a dry paint brush to remove all eraser crumbs.



WKR Update

(Right) The previous owner had replaced the couplers with new Micro-Trains couplers but did not paint them. Here we can see the couplers have been painted rust, but now matching craft paint was used to paint the black coupler boxes Harbor Mist Grey.

(Right) This view shows the grills after cleaning with the eraser, the couplers painted, and now the final touch, the boarding hand rails Are painted "safety white."




