


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The principal purpose of the **Operations Special Interest Group** (OPSIG) is to discuss, develop and disseminate ways of operating model railroads to realistically emulate practices of the prototype. This includes sharing information on various methods of generating, moving, and controlling traffic to heighten the feeling that our models are an active and integral part of the national rail transportation network, serving shippers and consignees throughout the nation. We also discuss and communicate information about the methods and procedures used by the real railroads and ways of most practically and realistically adapting them to the model world. So, if you like to operate the railroad you have created, this is a place to learn more and find others with similar interests.

We publish a quarterly magazine, <u>The Dispatcher's Office</u>, which in addition to containing articles and information on railroad operations (both prototype and model), contains listings of operating layouts, sessions, and events that members are invited to attend. Back issues are available. In addition, the OPSIG web site serves as a clearinghouse for publicizing regional operating events and meetings, where layouts are open for guest operations.

As part of your yearly membership, you will receive four quarterly issues of *The Dispatcher's Office*, our operations-focused publication. *The Dispatcher's Office* is available as either a digital download or a mailed printed copy. As a print subscriber, you will also get access to the digital copy. In 2011 Midwest Model Railroad started with the idea of making this hobby more accessible to everyone. Since day one we have striven to keep our operating costs to a bare minimum and pass on those savings to you, the hobby's best customers.

As of 2022 we are succeeding in offering some of the best prices anywhere in the hobby. Some great side effects of this goal have been the creation of real-time inventory on our website and a turnaround time of just one day between purchase and shipping.

In fall 2020 we moved to a new 9,000sqft location in Independence Missouri that serves as both our retail location and our shipping facility. Then in summer 2021 we expanded even more acquiring an additional 6,000sqft, bringing our total to 15,000sqft of model railroad product, slot cars, board games, and more.



The BNSF 8032 and 7155 are GE ES44C4's.



From Trains & Locos Wiki: The **GE** (General Electric) **ES44C4** is a type of six-axle, A1A-trucked, AC-traction, 4,400hp type of diesel locomotive built from 2010-present.

The model was the very first A1A-trucked (meaning that the center axles are unpowered) diesel locomotive built in North America since the late-1950's and is also the very first ever domestic AC-traction diesel locomotive built with such feature.

A total of 1200+ have been built thus far for **BNSF Railway**, as of 2015, the ES44C4 is now classified as an "ET44C4" ("T" for "Tier" or "ET" for "Evolution Technology") and is built to follow US EPA Tier 4 regulations. BNSF #3916 was the first ever Tier 4 production GEVO unit built, and more are expected to be delivered by mid-2016.

It is essentially a four-motor version of the C-C ES44AC.



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
In early November, the Purchasing Department of the WKR took delivery of six, new, MoPac grain hoppers from Intermountain. They are very nice cars in all respects, so the Car Department was able to get them ready for revenue service on the WKR with truck upgrades.



(Left) The first step was to remove all the Intermountain trucks.

(Below) Next, Micro-Trains replacement trucks were located, and the plastic wheel sets also removed.





(left) The staff of the Car Department use wood skewers inserted into the bolster holes to hold the trucks firmly while painting

(Right) The WKR Car Department has standardized on the use of Micro-Trains trucks loaded with ESM (Eastern Seaboard Models) metal wheels.

We use a mix of 33-inch and 36-inch diameter wheels depending on the car type.

The combination of the ESM wheels and Micro-Trains trucks result in cars that rarely derail and are much more free rolling, less rolling resistance means longer trains. The Micro-Trains coupler standard means far less uncoupling making operating sessions far more enjoyable.





(Left) The Car Department staff use an assembly line type of procedure to perform the modifications. The first step is to trim the coupler pins to eliminate the curve, this means easier uncoupling by hand since the WKR does not use magnets for uncoupling.

The second step is to add the "rear" wheel set so when the side frames are painted the truck can sit on the wheels not the wet paint.


The third step on the line is to mount all the trucks on the skewers with the coupler box outward for painting.

The next stop on the line is painting the coupler box with the appropriate body color. In this photo, the coupler box has received it is first coat of light grey. With light colors it requires two or more coats to cover the black or brown plastic color.

(Right) This truck has received the second coat of body color and has also moved down the line to the next step, painting all the coupler trip pins black to simulate air hoses.

(Below) To keep all parts together with the car, the car body is placed on the far left of the cutting mat, next come the bolster pins, followed by both trucks. These trucks have also completed the next step of having the truck side frames and couplers painted with Model Masters "Rust" color and are now ready for the final steps.







(Left) This truck has completed all steps on the line; the coupler box is now body color, the truck side frames and coupler are rust color, the air hose is painted black, and finally, the metal wheel sets have been painted on the outside, the inside, and the axles.

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

It is a 24-page all-color publication and will grow even larger as the society grows and more members contribute more information.
