
In August of 1996, BNSF ordered from GE a C44-9W and 998 is the original number.

WKR Update

I rapidly discovered upon moving the WKR into the new metal building last year that there is one major drawback, that unless you build interior rooms (reducing the space / increasing the cost) there is no place to store your stuff.


I purchased months ago four storage cabinets, but there were two problems: not enough space and the shelves were too flimsy and could not hold the weight. (right)





Earlier this month (December) I went to Wal-Mart and purchased two new cabinets (all they had in stock), then ordered four more on-line. (left)

Now I have six new cabinets with stronger shelves and are now along the back wall of the building. I mounted an emergency light to the top of the end cabinet which automatically lights in case the power fails.






12/25/20 Getting A Christmas Gift Ready For The WKR N-scale Layout...

I bought...I mean my Wife bought me a pair of new Atlas chemical hoppers for Christmas (see the doggie package tag where she expresses her undying love...yeah I wrote that too).



First step is to disassemble then shorten the coupler pins, replace the plastic wheels with metal ones, paint the wheels, trucks, and couplers with "rust". I also add additional weight to the body and re-assemble.



WKR Update



(Left) Some time ago I decided that all new cars added to the WKR will either have metal wheel sets or be swapped out as these were.

In addition, all wheels, truck side frames, and couplers are to be painted with "Rust" color

(Below) Since the new metal wheels have such low rolling resistance, I have nearly doubled the NMRA Recommended Practice with weight as I have added %-ounce to the original car weights.



(Below) The finished pair on the WKR layout...



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


The **2021 Tulsa Union Convention** is approaching, and we are offering a series of "peeks" at a few of the magnificent Model Railroading empires in the Tulsa area. This month we preview Steve Davis' "Kansas City Southern – **3**rd Sub" HO-scale layout.

The KCS -3^{rd} Sub is housed in a metal building and fills most of it. Walking in the door you enter the crew lounge and Dispatcher's office. Passing through an inner door and turning right you find the main staging area. The layout begins at the lowest level of the helix (above) and continuously climbs to end on the upper staging yard on the top level of the double track helix.

Trains are staged in the yard that extend from the helix around to the entry door. (Right) The track goes around the door frame to the main yard in the main room.

The layout features long halls

Steve Davis describes his layout in the Official Timetable of the Layout Design and Operations Weekend, "The KCS 3rd Sub is located in Coweta, Oklahoma in a 30' by 52' metal building. The HO scale layout models the Kansas City Southern Railroad between Watts and Heavener, Oklahoma in 1982.

It is mostly single deck but has a raised "mushroom" section along one portion. Work started in March 2009 so it is still under construction and not fully scenicked [Ed – this was written in 2016]

The layout is a CTC operation (as was the prototype) with signals and a Dispatcher, except on the branch lines. The goal was to follow the prototype as faithfully as possible, so in each the spurs and industries are laid out as per the KCS SLIC, track charts from the era, as well as resources like Sanborn maps. Key bridges and features such as the bridge over the Arkansas River near Gans, OK. And the tunnel on the Ft. Smith branch (the only Railroad tunnel in the state of Oklahoma) are also modeled. The Missouri Pacific crossing and interchange at Sallisaw are modeled with some MoPac traffic.

Operations are likewise based on the actual trains and operations in 1982 as gleaned from lineups recorded by Frank Bryan and other research thanks to the Kansas City Southern Historical Society. Most locomotives are equipped with sound. Switching is with computer-generated switchlists."


The KCS 3rd sub operates with a crew of 11 using Digitrax DCC with radio throttles.






































(Above Left) The steps up to the mushroom (Above Right) Looking back down the hall from the mushroom (Below) Looking across the back of the mushroom






(Left) The left side of the back of the mushroom. I had difficulties switching this area as the switch was locked, you had to call Dispatch to unlock, but only for a specified time.

Of course, I had to call Dispatch a couple of time to reunlock the switch.

(Below) Around the corner is the last part of the mushroom area. At the very end of the hall is the entry to the upper staging yard which leads back to the helix.






(Above) Steve is a Broadcast Engineer for TV by trade, and so loves electronics. Every piece of rolling stock has RFID tags with readers at the entrance and exit of the main yard. As the trains roll in, the information is displayed in real time on tablets mounted on spring arms.

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
