


A view of the "Wichita & Ark Valley Railroad" HO-scale layout built by the Augusta Model Railroad Club in Augusta, Kansas

Part II

The second session of Rocky Ops (North) 2019 was held on Saturday, May 4th at Denny Krausman's HO-scale AT&SF Colorado Division layout, a point-to-point with 200-feet of main line and 50-feet of branch line. Denny describes his layout as a prototypical design based on the Santa Fe's line through Southeastern Colorado in 1948. The Operating District is from Dodge City, Kansas to La Junta, Colorado on the first district with the modeled portion being from Medway siding in Kansas to Granada, CO. The Second District is modeled from Holly, CO to Kornman.








