





Another layout in the "Plaza" area was the HO-scale modular layout from the Albuquerque Society Of Module Engineers.



















Easily the largest layout in the Show was also located in the "Plaza" area, the G-scale display from the Denver Garden Railway Society.

The "Plaza" area was divided into three levels. Our layout was located on the highest level near the entrance, the Disneyland and Albuquerque layouts and vendors were on the middle level, while this layout and others were on the lowest level in front of the stage area.








Also on the lower level of the Plaza was a big attraction for the youngsters, a train ride where the riders pushed and pulled the yokes to provide the propulsion.

Late in the afternoon on Saturday when it had quieted down a bit, I was able to get some shots of the layouts on the Plaza. The north entry doors are on the upper right, so we had good traffic all day. This is the N-scale Western Kansas Rails layout as displayed by the Western Kansas Division, NMRA.

The grain elevator in the foreground as well as many of the other buildings on the layout are scratch-built. The layout also participated in the very popular "Junior Engineer" program, where after signing-up, youth could seek-out the test stations and do various things from answering questions to running trains to mild operations on various layouts.


