The Friends of the Burlington Northern Railroad (FOBNR)

The historical society was incorporated on January 3, 1993. It was chartered to gather, preserve, and share information about the history of the Burlington Northern Railroad. The group began with about 140 members absorbed from the Burlington Northern Historical Society. In 1996, following the merger between Burlington Northern and Santa Fe, the group voted to follow the Burlington Northern from 1970 to 1995 and the BNSF from 1995 to the present. Then in 2018 we added coverage of the Montana Rail Link.



The Group's quarterly publication, the *BN Expediter*, is the voice of the organization that shares news about the group's activities, BN historical data, and current operations of the railroad. It is a 24-page all-color publication and will grow even larger as the society grows and more members contribute more information.

The society also has an annual convention at some location on the BNSF system with programs, tours, displays, a banquet with a keynote speaker, and a business meeting.



Where does the life of rail itself begin? It starts as hot rolled carbon steel strong enough to withstand the impact of thousands of tons of a train's weight. The rail is uniformly shaped with a special design to support and guide the train's flanged wheels as it heads down the track. To turn the steel sticks into continuous welded rail, three BNSF rail welding complexes operate in assembly-line fashion to weld the pieces together.

In early April I happened upon a Loram rail grinding train at rest in the BNSF yard behind the depot. While staying on the station platform by necessity these are all zoom shots.











(From February) In Dodge City, Kansas, **Kansas Feeds, Inc.**, a manufacturer of cattle feed components, has greatly expanded their West Plant. They added new holding tanks, expanded their tank car unloading facility, and new metal buildings. I believe the tank cars come in loaded with molasses, an ingredient in cattle feed mix. The molasses is pumped into the holding tanks, mixed with vitamins and other nutrients, then sent to feed yards to be mixed with dry cattle feed.

(Currently) Kansas feeds, Inc. has added exterior coverings and perhaps insulation and heating elements for cold weather operations. The unloading tracks curve to the left ahead of the pictured tank cars and are probably twice the length shown in the photo.



(Right) A closer view of the completed tanks. For modeling purposes, not the concrete spill containment wall that surrounds the tanks. We will try to get a better shot of the unloading pipe rack between the two tracks in the future.


2023 Regional Convention






The principal purpose of the **Operations Special Interest Group** (OPSIG) is to discuss, develop and disseminate ways of operating model railroads to realistically emulate practices of the prototype. This includes sharing information on various methods of generating, moving, and controlling traffic to heighten the feeling that our models are an active and integral part of the national rail transportation network, serving shippers and consignees throughout the nation. We also discuss and communicate information about the methods and procedures used by the real railroads and ways of most practically and realistically adapting them to the model world. So, if you like to operate the railroad you've created, this is a place to learn more and find others with similar interests.

We publish a quarterly magazine, *The Dispatcher's Office*, which in addition to containing articles and information on railroad operations (both prototype and model), contains listings of operating layouts, sessions, and events that members are invited to attend. Back issues are available.

In addition, the OPSIG web site serves as a clearinghouse for publicizing regional operating events and meetings, where layouts are open for guest operations. We also send out the *Second Section* email newsletter on a regular basis.



ALCO Century 855



(From Wikipedia) The **ALCO Century 855** was a model of 5,500 hp diesel-electric locomotive built in 1964 by the American Locomotive Company for the Union Pacific Railroad. The locomotive was notable for being ALCO's most powerful diesel-electric locomotive and, at the time, the most powerful diesel locomotive ever built, being surpassed by the 6,600-horsepower EMD DDA40X in April 1969.

Union Pacific wished to reduce the number of locomotives needed on a consist, to keep in line with their allowable gross weight limit. By consolidating several locomotives into one or two, this allowed them to lower the axle load on the rails, but to stay within the limits placed by the company.

Only three were built and they spent their lives in the general freight pool at North Platte; however, constant shutting down due to overheating & poor performance with its twin prime movers led to their early retirement and eventual scrapping by February 1972, after only being in service for less than eight years.







In April, the WKR Weathering Department decided to get busy and try to "age" a new Intermountain Kansas City Southern SD40-2. This was our first attempt at severely aging a locomotive, so as usual we applied way too much of the colors, then used alcohol on a swab to reduce the effect to get better results.



The first step was to fade the original paint using a very thin wash of white craft paint. This was slathered on the locomotive and allowed to dry overnight.

The crew then picked out three different shades of "rust" colors, very light (almost a tan) for new rust, a reddish medium shade, and finally a very dark (almost brown) for old rust.

We set about determining where water was most likely to collect, and then added the three different shades. It looked good at first, but after drying overnight, and viewing it in close-up photos, it looked garish with way too much paint applied.

The solution was to take our cone shaped foam swabs, dipped in alcohol, and then lightly stroke over the weathering, slowly removing the "too much" and it also gave a better "patchy" effect.

The final step was to use "grimy black" weathering powder, brushed over the exhaust area.

In late April, the Purchasing Department of the WKR received four new, Scale Trains C44-9Ws. These are "Rivet Counter" models with sound. The purchase included a single UP version and three ex-Southern Pacific "patch" units. The intent is to re-patch all four into the MPLX lease fleet. In our world, the Missouri Pacific was the dominant partner in the 1982 merger and took over all the other roads absorbed by the UP. In so doing, the MoPac created the Missouri Pacific Leasing Corp. (MPLX) to purchase older locos from other roads, rebuild them to dash-3 standards, then lease them back to the MoPac or other roads as needed.






