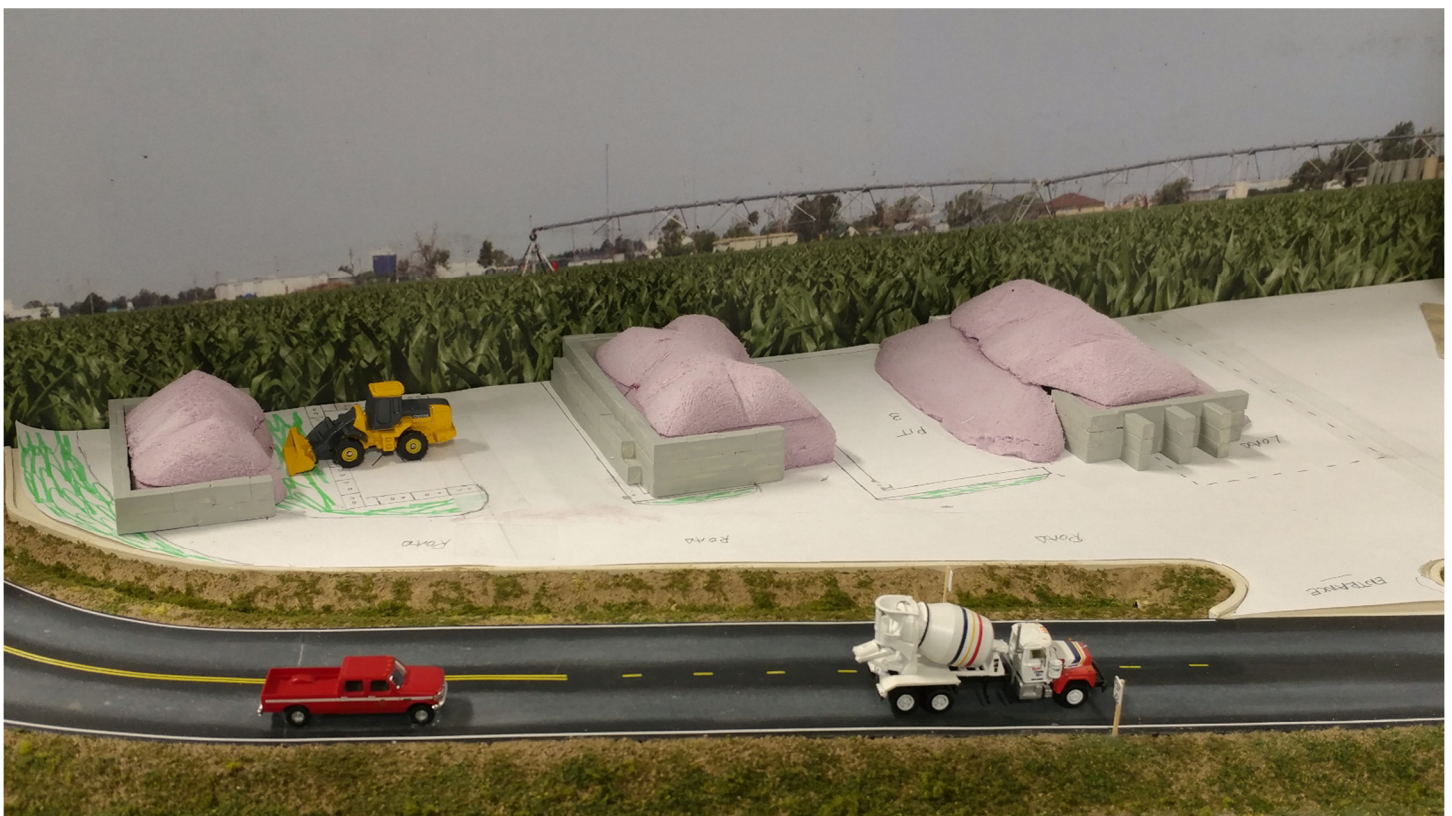

I have heard a lot of talk lately about the expense of this hobby, and with national inflation taking a bite out of everyone's buying power, hobby spending will be the first thing to eliminate. The cost of locomotives and rolling stock is certainly higher, but remember, we demanded DCC, sound, and a higher level of details. This having been said, there are ways to reduce your hobby expense.

Back in 1995 while building my first home layout, I realized that my wonderful track plan would require over forty track switches which were about \$16.00 each. I learned how to scratch-build my own switches for about \$4.00 each in materials, and as of now, I have completed well over 100-switches. There are many people who hand lay their trackwork.

After working as a Salesman for a General Contractor building homes, I took a fancy to scratch-building my own structures, instead of purchasing expensive building kits. One of the crowd-pleasing aspects of the WKR layout is very few of the structures are kits or based on kits that all the other layouts at a show have some version of.

Almost every area of this hobby can be mastered using basic components for a reduced cost, plus greater satisfaction in the accomplishment. To paraphrase an old saying, "When the going gets tough, the tough get scratch-building!"

Just recently I was looking for trains to photograph and came upon this scene at a Dodge City cattle feed mill. The mill is constructing four new above ground holding tanks and in this view, the newest is being constructed and the oldest is betrayed by the amount of rust.



This would add significant interest to any tank farm scene. Details to include would be:

- 1 Chain link fence
- 2 Containment berm around the tanks
- 3 Electrical conduits
- 4 Ladder
- 5 Construction debris around the base
- 6 Crane
- 7 Spiral staircase and safety rails

On the tank on the left, there is an electrical conduit which also shows on the completed tanks, and I can only speculate it is a control for blowers as there are vents in the roof.

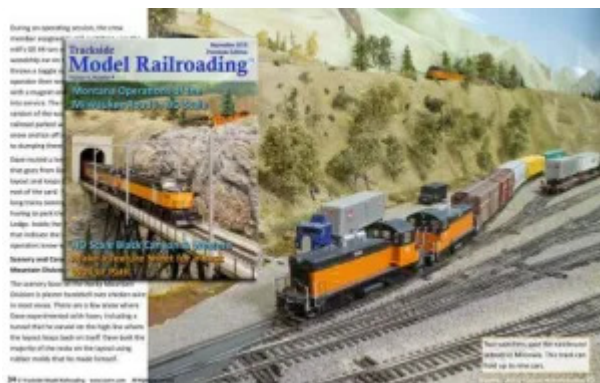

On the flip side, here is a closer view of some older tanks along with some interesting weathering. It appears for these tanks; everything is painter white except the roofs which are a dark grey or black.

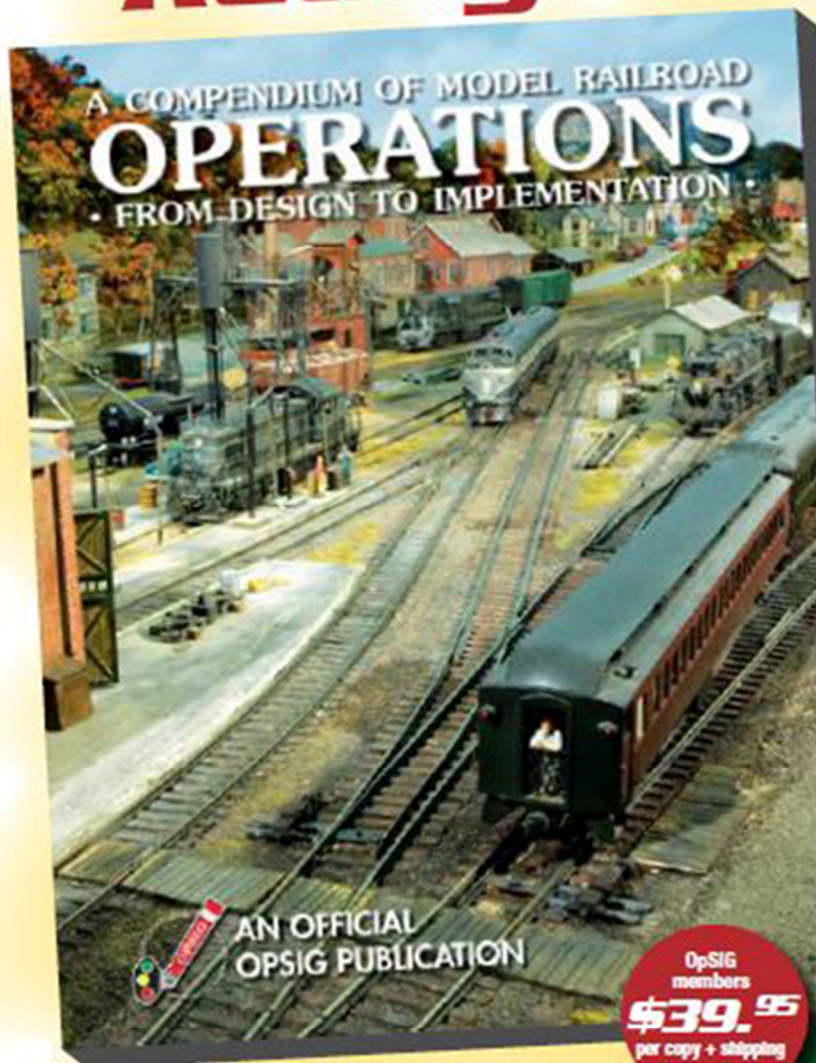

WKR Update

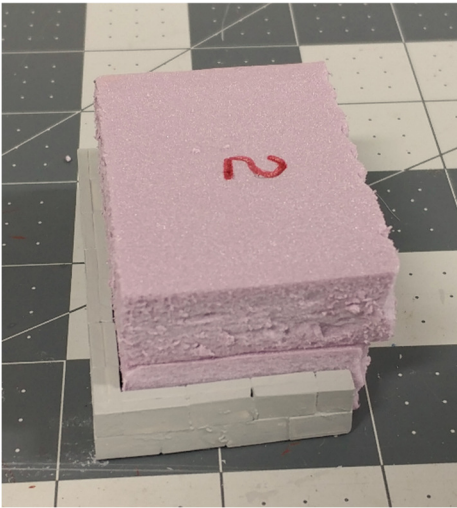


Last month, the scenery crew completed construction of the concrete block retaining walls for the three aggregate pits (Above). The next step is to use extruded foam board to simulate the aggregate mounds as close to the photo as possible. We used a serrated knife to remove a small section from the large sheet of extruded foam.



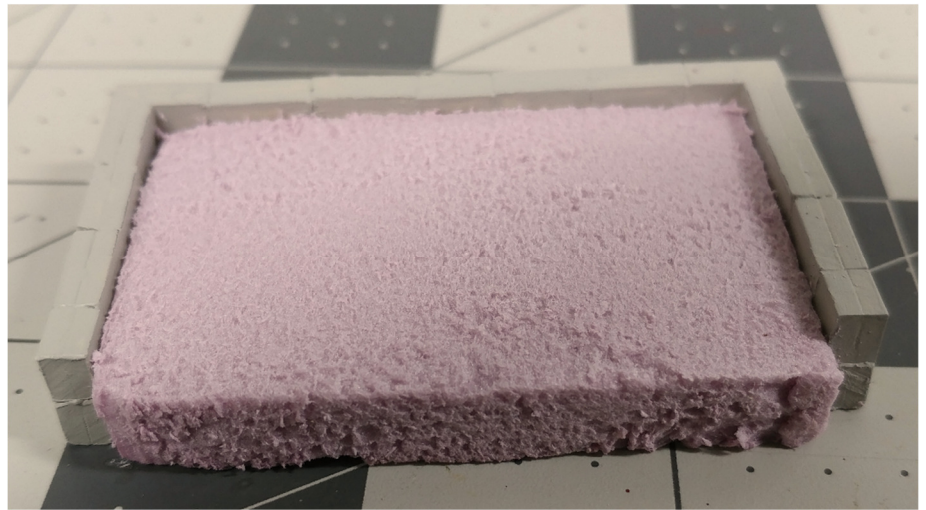
(Above) The first piece of foam was cut to shape to fit the first pit, but it will require a second layer to get the height for the aggregate mound.

WKR Update



(Left) Stacking the two pieces shows that two full pieces are too tall and would require excessive shaping to create the desired effect.

(Right) Slicing the first piece in half, in height, solved the issue of height.

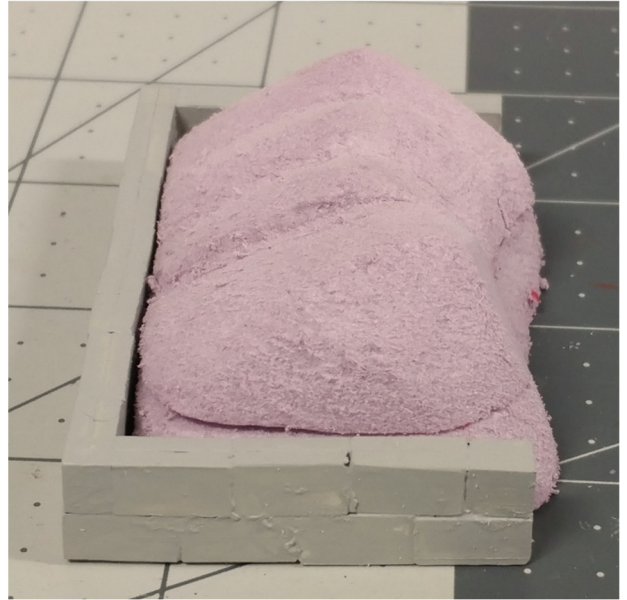
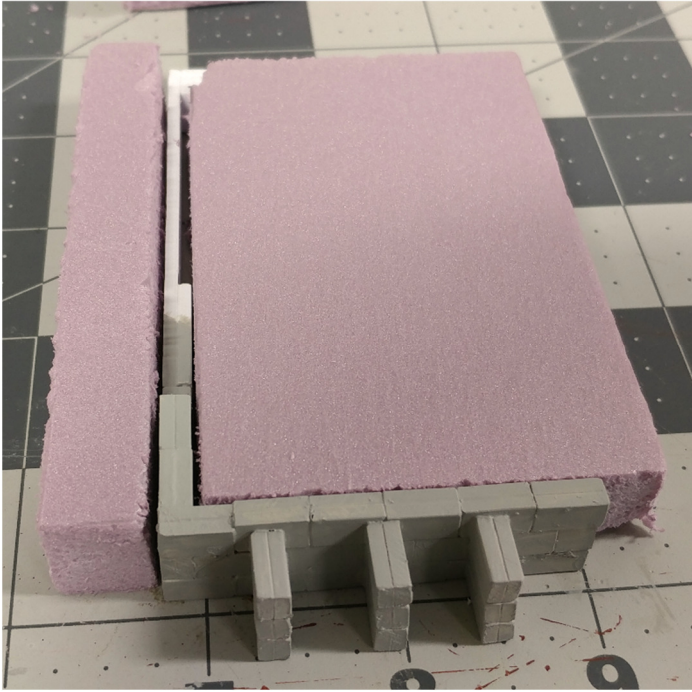


(Below) The Crew's secret for shaping foam board is a wood rasp to get the basic shape, followed up by sanding with a detail sander with 60 to 100-grit sandpaper to get the finished shape.

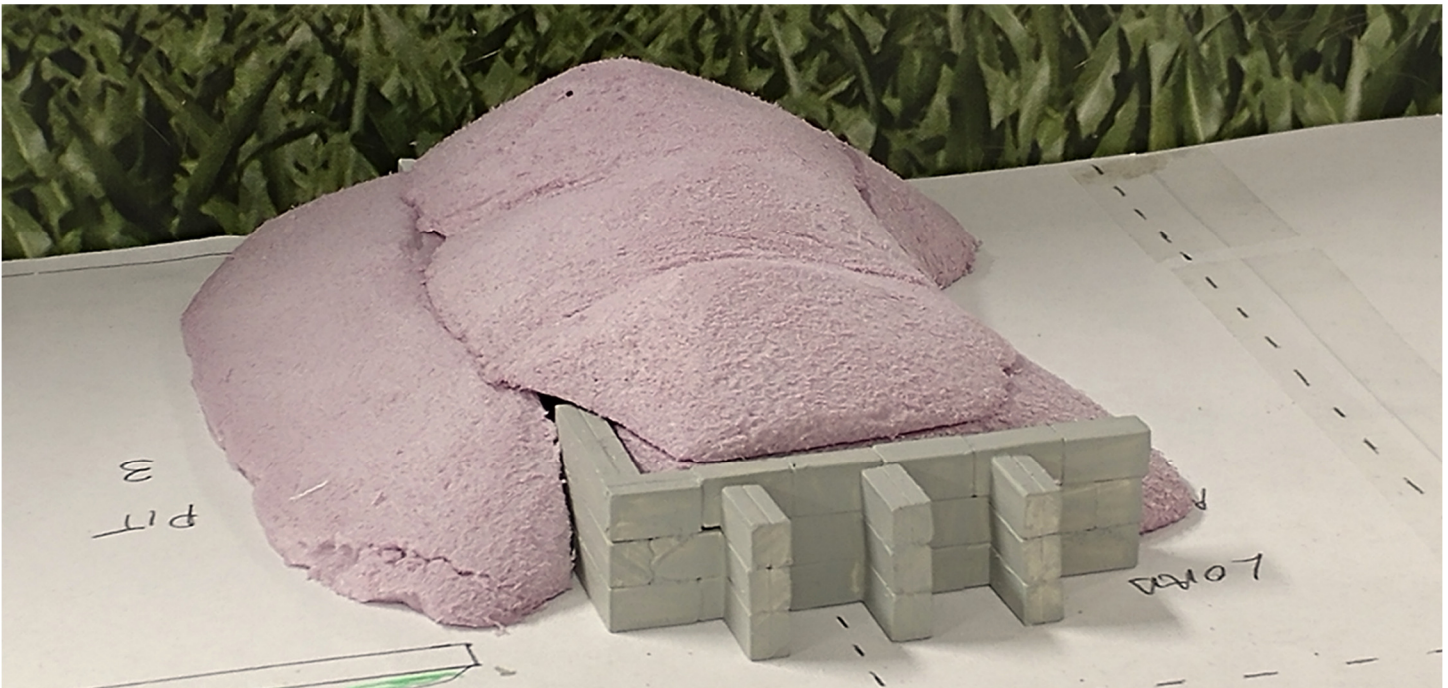

WKR Update



(Above) The three completed, shaped forms for the aggregate pits. Using a scale front-end loader, it became apparent that the pits needed to be spaced out more than the original plan allow for.

The next steps include acquiring the proper scale aggregate, so we visited the web site for **Arizona Rock & Mineral**, And then ordered several bags, in different sizes of the same colors including powders, and the shipment is in transit.

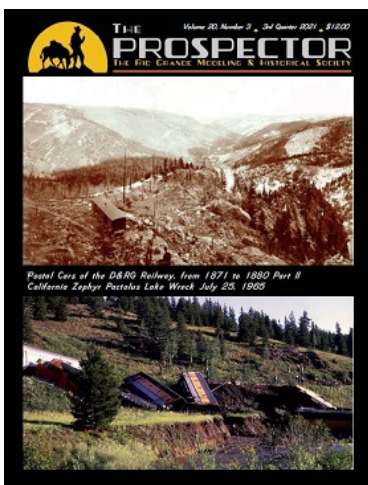
So, the process will begin by painting and weathering the retaining walls to closely match the photographs, then they will be glued in place on the module. The foam pieces will get a final shape tweaking and then will also be glued in place in each pit.

Once the aggregate shipment arrives, we will “paint” the foam shapes with glue mix, followed by a light coat of the proper aggregate. Once that first coating dries, a second coat will deliver the final shape. Then we will add the final scene elements such as dirt, grass, and weeds.

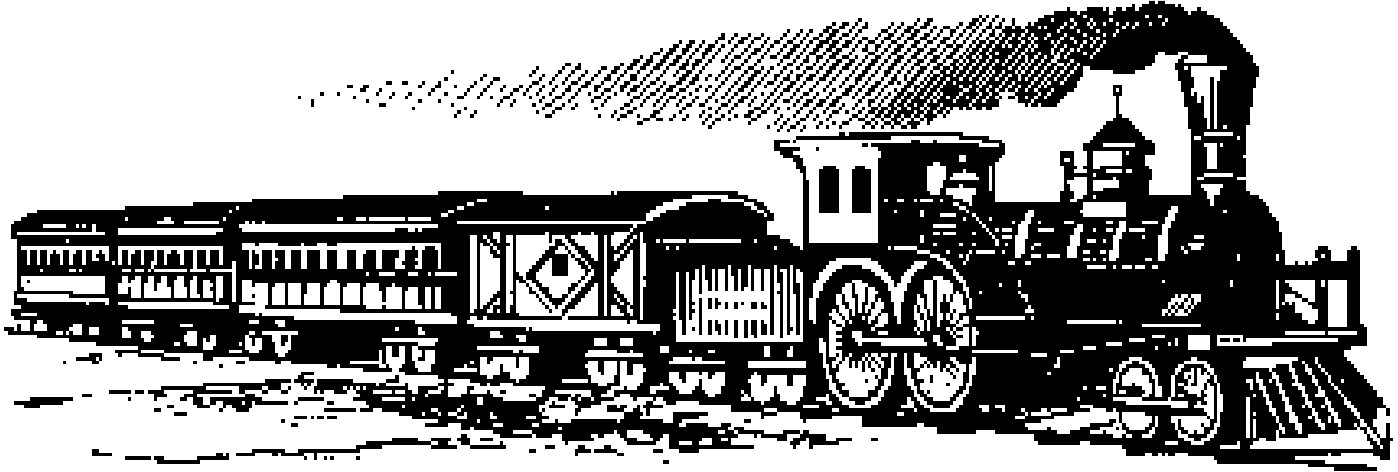
