Notice-Cancellation Policy Announcement

As we approach the 2021 Tulsa Union Convention, expenses will be incurred for registration materials and food/beverage for the Awards/Desert event. Since these expenses will be nonrefundable once incurred, we must similarly establish the following policy regarding the cancellation of registration fees.

You may cancel your registration on or before September 7th and receive a full refund. Starting September 8th, those cancelling their registration will receive a refund of 50% of their registration fees. There will be **no refund** of registration fees for those cancelling their registration on or after September 22nd.

We regret the establishment of this cancellation policy but believe it necessary to protect the sponsoring regions. Thank you for your understanding.

About N Scale Modular Railroading

The building of a module is not difficult. Building a module has the distinct advantage of "forcing" the builder to do all the phases of layout building, without having to do so much of one phase that they get "fed up" with it, as can happen when building a large home layout. So often the scenery doesn't get built or the track work is never made to work right, or some other building phase is neglected.

Getting a module ready for a scheduled meet will do wonders for a builder's speed and concentration! Another advantage is that the module can be turned on its side or upside down, making working on it much easier, providing better lighting, and making it possible to avoid hot solder drips. The module can be brought to another part of the house where the rest of the family is or taken outside when a smelly job needs doing. The small footprint also allows for experimentation with scenery techniques.




WKR Update

Last month, I challenged our readers to begin a new project on their or their Club's layout. On the WKR N-scale layout, there was one area that has not received its permanent structures yet, the concrete plant. I had planned to model the plant in Dodge city on Wyatt Earp Boulevard. I visited the plant last year, met the Manager, and took a lot of photos for reference.


(Below) A mosaic of several photos overlaid together to get a good view of the East side of the plant.




(Left) The first step is to use copy paper to make a template of the area in question. The outlines are traced, cut out, and overlapping sheets are secured with clear tape.

(Below) A close-up view showing the three aggregate pits in full scale size in relation to the area, the access road, and grassy areas.








While I am waiting on styrene supplies for the main structure, the tan building, I decided to construct the three


Looking through the stock of sheet styrene, it appeared that my last piece of 0.80" would do well, cut into scale 2.5' strips and then gluing two together, they became the 2.5' x 2.5' dimension, so I only needed to cut to the 5' length.


> (Left) One of the better tool purchases I have made for the hobby was this mini table saw from Micro-Mark. It makes cutting straight lines very easy, and in this case, once the fence is set for the 5' scale length, I can make as many cuts as necessary.


(Right) Using the table saw we were able to cut multiple strips of 0.80" into the 2.5' scale width from the original sheet

WKR Update



(Above) All three retaining walls are complete. On Pit 3, the aggregate overflows the pit, so only the outer portion of the retaining wall will be seen and so modeled. To model the aggregate itself, I plan on using extruded foam board cut and shaped according to the prototype photo and then covered with the proper size and color of sand.

I have ordered one sheet of all the available sizes of sheet styrene to match the metal siding of the main structure, and once the proper size is determined, I will order more to get started on the main structure. More to come...






Interested in the Union Pacific check out the Union Pacific Historical Society:

Long a fixture at the end of trains, Mark discusses how cabooses impacted operations at terminals, how they were supplied, and why some cabooses were more common on certain subdivisions than others, and much more. Today most rural depots are gone, but for decades they were a fixture in small towns throughout the Union Pacific system. 
