We publish a quarterly magazine, <u>The Dispatcher's Office</u>, which in addition to containing articles and information on railroad operations (both prototype and model), contains listings of operating layouts, sessions, and events that members are invited to attend.

<u>Back issues are available</u>. In addition, the OPSIG web site serves as a clearinghouse for publicizing <u>regional operating events</u> and meetings, where layouts are open for guest operations.

On September 19th, I happened to catch the Cimarron Valley 1053 visiting the Dodge City BNSF yard along with the 5951. First, let's look back at the history of the Cimarron Valley Railroad.

From Wikipedia: The **Cimarron Valley Railroad** (reporting mark **CVR**) was built c. 1912 and purchased from Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad in February 1996. It runs over former C.V. and Manter Subdivisions




of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad tracks in Oklahoma, Colorado and Kansas. One line runs from Dodge City, KS to Boise City, OK, the other from Satanta, KS to Springfield, CO. It runs a total of 254 miles of track primarily hauling agricultural commodities (such as wheat, corn, and milo), along with sand, cement, poles, pipe, and fertilizers.

On November 1, 2020, The Cimarron Valley Railroad was purchased by **Jaguar Transport Holdings, LLC**.



(above) The CVR acquired seven General Electric locomotives, four B40-8s and three **C40-8s** (one of which is the 1053 above), all formerly operated by CSX. The Dash 8s have been certified by the original manufacturer, GE Transportation and have undergone extensive 100-point checks.





(Left) The East end of the Dodge City yard has recently seen the installation of two new switches just West of the bridge over Underpass Road. This switch was cut in on the North side to run a spur to the ADM milling facility on Wyatt Earp Blvd.







(Left) Looking West from the new switch, the spur to the left of the picture goes to the cattle feed producer.

There was a similar company in Holcomb, KS. Called Agridyne which I model on the layout, so I believe this company receives tank cars of molasses and other liquid vitamins/minerals, which are blended together in proportion and stored in large storage tanks, then transferred to tank truck for delivery to cattle feed yards to be mixed into the dry cattle feed.

The two middle tracks go into the yard.

(Right) This is a zoom shot of the spur into the cattle feed producer.



(Below) Moving down to Trail Street (South of the yard), the cattle feed producer has recently expanded their facility with an extension of the rail lines, construction of an additional unloading facility, additional building, plus four new storage tanks (black).

(Left) This new line extension curves around to join the original line.



(Above) On the other side of the tracks, there is a little more activity at the ADM milling facility. Here a Trackmobile is in charge of a hopper car.



Rapido is proud to present the Procor 5820 Covered Hopper car, now in N scale. Designed fully by Procor, this hopper was built in batches from the late 70s all the way up through the early 90s. Around 1500 examples were built for Procor and Dow Chemical in their Oakville, Ontario facility. Essex Hybrid would later receive a handful of cars for seed service. Many of these were ex Procor hoppers patched out.

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

(Below) Now the model elevator also has the strands of wheat mural.








