Over the past week we have finally been allowed to start expanding into our new space. As some know that have come by, things have been moved. It is a bit of a process but things are really starting to




find their new home in the new expanded space. New checkout area construction started and we look forward to having a space where people can congregate and talk trains again.

We always strive for honesty. That's why we'd like to share a few insights into some unexpected market changes we've experienced over the past several months.

Since March, international transportation costs for containers have tripled due to extremely limited vessel space. At the same time, transit times have increased from 5-weeks to 10-weeks and sometimes longer. We've also been experiencing product and component price increases after we have received customer preorders and placed purchase orders for several models. This is mainly due to raw material shortages. We've absorbed these costs and have no plans to increase prices for existing preorders.


We're continuing to experience larger than usual price changes for our monthly announcements. When this is coupled with higher inbound shipping and component costs, the percentage increase is into the double digits. To make the math easy, let's say our total unit cost has increased by 10% over the past six months (it's actually more). This means the selling price for a Rivet Counter Gunderson 5188 Covered Hopper should increase by \$4.50 to \$49.49. We know this is not welcome news so we're sharing the cost by only increasing our selling price by \$3.

This will impact our selling price for locomotives as well. A 10% price increase for a Rivet Counter DCC & Sound locomotive currently selling for \$274.99 would add \$27.50. We will share a portion of the increase which will likely result in a \$15 price change.

Some companies would pass along the full amount and often more. In keeping with one of our guiding principles, we always strive to provide the best value possible while continually investing in all-new models, services, and more.

No one enjoys price increases including us. Unfortunately, we expect higher than usual price changes for the next several months due to continued market challenges. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. We truly appreciate your understanding, support, and business.

WKR Update



The month of August saw a return to operations on the Western Kansas Rails (WKR) layout. Part of that was a restructure of the operations of turning the trains.

Keeping the operations simple was the goal so interested spectators and fellow operators could learn the basics of operations without getting lost in the weeds. With a small layout, we only use two trains, Train 1, and Train 2. To make it more interesting, we decided to simply change the direction of each train but kept the running order the same.

Now we decided to also reverse the order of running to be more realistic, so Train 1 which was Eastbound, now becomes train 3 Westbound with the running order reversed. This creates more interest as trailing point switches now become facing point switches with run-around movements, and at times loads are dropped off while empties are still there, a nice improvement,

(Above) Part of the "movie magic" is provided by the bell & Howell "TAC Camera", a small (about 1-inch cubed) camera that has a built-in rechargeable battery and provided memory card. It will not fit into a N-scale locomotive, but we modified an old flatcar to give that vantage point.



(Right) We used an old, Atlas flat car for the base, then raided the scraps box to build a cradle, move the camera near the rear of the car, and raise it up to engine cab height.

We tried using the camera on the front of the car, but the focal length would blur the video if coupled to a car in front. After several tries, we found about ¾ back on the car was just about right. The TAC camera is very inexpensive and so has drawbacks. You can not see what you are recording, so sometimes you need to do it over. The camera downloads and charges through your computer, and you need a video editing program to edit the separate files together. All things considered, it's a nice, inexpensive way to get cab views of your layout.


WKR Update



Another part of the video production is a tripod. This unit has an adapter mounted to hold a cell phone but can also hold a video camera.


The big "movie" news this month was discovered with the video editing software. In the past, we only did cab or ground views using the TAC camera, or regular video with the cell phone of video camera as they use different video files.

As an experiment, we recently tried combining to the video formats into one video, and it worked. Now our videos can contain multiple views of the same operation. This takes more time as you need to do a movement with the TAC camera car on the front, then back up, remove the camera car, and shoot it again from a different perspective. This opens up a lot of potential.



(Above) A screen shot from the software we use, *Cyberlink Media Suite*. This helps us download the video files from the camera, and allows complete editing features including the "time line" editing mode shown. Once your editing is completed, the software "produces" the separate segments into a seamless video which can them be saved or uploaded to internet sites.

(Above) Having decided to pull some old Con-Cor autoracks out of storage and return them to service, it was determined to increase the weight by one full ounce.



(Left) To bring them up to WKR specs, the plastic Micro-Trains wheels were replaced with new, metal wheel sets from ESM, which were painted "rust" color.


