

There is ample space here for many activities and will be a convenient starting point for prototype and home layout tours. The prototype tours we are working on include tours of several of these improved rail vards, a MATA trolley shop tour, a steel mill tour, and of course the FedEx Super hub tour that was extremely popular in 2006. We may extend the convention activities into Thursday to allow us to offer a third night for this tour. It is limited to 25 persons per night and will be first come first served so if you want to see one of the premier industrial to 36 in the world get you registration with that request in early. We are working with MATA on including a pass to ride the trolleys during the convention in your registration. There are several high quality home model railroads available for tour including the late Louis Ertz's West Tennessee Central Railroad, an exquisite O scale layout that has been featured in Model Railroader and O Scale Railroading magazines. We also have a unique situation in Memphis with all of the club model railroads being housed in the same building. There are seven model railroads in six scales that will be shown. For all of the OpSIG members the N scale layout modeling the L&N Memphis Sub is set up for operating sessions. It has 22 scale miles of the 210 mile division modeled. There are a couple of special events happening around convention time that will be included in the convention activities. Central Station, home of the Memphis Railroad and Trolley Museum will be 100

years old and we are going to have special events throughout the year to commemorate that milestone. The convention will be one of those events and we are arranging to have a special tour of the station for the convention. The other event will be the opening of the Harahan Bridge walkway/bikeway which will allow you to walk or bicycle across the Union Pacific Harahan Bridge. The opening is scheduled close to convention time so it will be included in convention events. For the ladies, across the street from Harding Academy are Dixon Gallery and Gardens and Audabon Park and Memphis Botanic Gardens. Oak Court Mall and other fine shopping are close by and some of the ladies here are planning several other activities. The convention website will be on the Memphis Railroad and Trolley Museum website by mid-June and will include the ability to register on line. Be watching at: www.mrtm.org

# **Kenny Cline Award**

This award is given by the last three recipients, in recognition of outstanding service to the Mid-Continent Region and to the Hobby of Model Railroading.

Kenny Cline served as Secretary/Treasurer for Several terms, as Vice-president for 1 two year term (1977 & 78) and served as President for one year term (1979) before passing away in office. Allan Pollock, his Vicepresident, complete his uncompleted term. The highest award that the Mid Continent Region can bestow upon an individual is that of the KEN CLINE AWARD. This award, established by the MCoR BOD in June of 1981, is given annually to someone in recognition of service to the Region, the NMRA, and the hobby in general. It occurred to me, however, that many of our members never had the privilege of knowing Ken personally. I asked former MCoR President Warren Weston, MMR of Lee's Summit, MO to tell us all a little about this gentleman whom our Region holds in such high esteem. The following, with a little editing on my part, are the words of Warren Weston telling us about his good friend, Ken Cline."...it was suggested that I put some memories down so that you might also know

Ken Cline better. Ken, Kenneth R. Cline lived in Independence, MO with his wife Irene, and raised three daughters. Ken has a B.S. in Education and a M.S. in Guidance and Counseling. He was employed by the Independence School District as a visiting teacher (truant officer). We had started a new model club (HO) that had finally found a home in the basement of a hobby shop on East Lexington near the square.

During this era (the early 60's) we moved across the street to another basement that was more accessible and business-like. By accident, we found that we could get rid of most of our trash just by wrapping it up to look valuable, then carrying it to the top of the stars. By the time we got back up with another load to take home, the first package was gone. Bill Herd linger, Tom Bennett, Larry Kombrink, David Wade, Chuck Schrivener, Ken, and this writer, were some of the members of this group.

After a heart attack in the Mid 50's, Ken moved from modeling airplanes and boats, to TT scale model railroading. Later came HO and then he saw the "true light" of modeling as spoken by Swede Norlin; Sn3. Model building was always good therapy for Ken. He built a 10'x20' Sn3 layout in his \* basement, and the S Gang; Jim Phelps, Dave Engle, Mike Kane, Dave Pausell, Pete Bellos, Jim Graham, Dick Y. Wholf, and others would get together. At the 1970 Convention, he took a First Place for his Rio Grande work gondola.

Ken was later appointed Area Director and under his tutelage we had our first Area Meet. Starting at the Carousel on Troost for just gab sessions. From



here the idea just grew. Elected to the first of five terms as Secretary/Treasurer in 1972, he served the Region well. During this time he received Achievement Awards for Association Official and Association Volunteer. Awarded the Kenny John Memorial Award in 1974 at Des Moines he went on to be elected Vice President in 1977, and Region President in 1979. Just starting his second term as President, he suffered congestive heart failure on September 5, 1980, and died. His San Juan Railroad was now

silent.

Ken was a dedicated modeler and most importantly, a person in service to modelers. He was quiet and jovial with his good humor to keep things running smoothly. He has been missed, and it is good to remember him with the "Ken Cline Award".

# Golden Spike at a Golden Age

I was looking for a hobby and I always did like trains. As a matter of fact, when I was but a young pup, my six siblings and I had to take lodging in an old wooden Pullman car on a side track in South Omaha over by the stockyards. Circumstances dictated that we had to leave our house and find an alternative place to stay for a while. My oldest sister had spoken to a railroader who mentioned that there was this empty car and we soon made sure it was empty no longer. It had been converted to a MOW dormitory with bunk beds, a pot bellied stove, a table and a few chairs. To us kids, it became and was home for the better part of a year. Life was tough, the weather sometimes real cold and food wasn't always on the table on a regular basis. We woke up every morning around five o'clock as the passing steam locomotives would blow on their whistles and blast us out of bed. But we made it until the truant officers got a hold of us and then we went into separate foster homes.

We all grew up and made our living. I farmed for many years down in Wisner, Nebraska. Often I would see the freights and sometimes the passenger trains as they rumbled past towards Norfolk. Some of the local beef cattle found their way in some of those real old stock cars on the way to market in Sioux City, Iowa. In later years, I moved to Wayne and worked in Pender, NE, welding feed bins for cattle until my retirement a few months ago.


I eventually joined up with an outfit called the Cowboy Line Division that met regularly in Norfolk, Nebras-ka. I also became an NMRA member a few years ago. All the guys were pretty nice to me and did encourage me to participate in the Achievement Program. I really didn't know a whole lot about modeling but I do enjoy HO scale and the steam engines. At each monthly meeting of the group, I kept learning a little more about model railroading. For example, I watched how clinics were presented and I actually have presented a few. Contributing articles for the newsletter was also encouraged. I do like to build structures and then write a short article for the newsletter. Another member showed me how to take photos of these structures and I would also include these with my article.





I really got started when I made some room in my cluttered basement for a 4 by 8 foot chunk of plywood with a double set of rails on it. I wanted to see if I could somehow put both the town of Wisner and Miss Kitty's Dodge City on it and model two different eras of rail history. I figured that if I placed a partition across this piece of plywood diagonally, both Wisner and Dodge City would have their own space. I really wanted to get my Golden Spike and I decided to do Wisner first.





My friend Jim and I took a road trip and I shot these photos out of the Centennial Book at the Wisner Public Library. The librarian was very nice to let me do this.

I started to make some cardboard structures to get some idea about HO scale size and to also use these on the layout. At a few train shows that I visited, I purchased several used structures, trees, and box cars. Some of these were used to practice my weathering technique. Others, like the reject trees were refurbished or repainted and used. During this last winter, I helped Jim on another project where I learned the basics of fastening rail on cork road bed, attach the electrical wires, and then properly ballast the rails. I made several dioramas that were presented as clinics and allowed me to use my imagination and to also help me learn the basics of scenery. Here follow some examples:







In the above requirement, a flat car was transformed into a lumber carrier with stakes as added details. Next are some cardboard structures and refurbishing a tree:







Presenting the clinic pictured below, I had to lay down rails on cork road bed, ballast these rails, place scenery items including buildings, trees, rocks, bushes, telephone poles, and ground cover. All these little steps would give me some experience to apply on my own layout.





Well, this is it. I am 71 years old and I am going to ask our Cowboy Line Division AP chairman Bryan to check out my efforts and see if I qualify for the Golden Spike award.









What do you think? I had fun!



# A few words from the President Midterm Progress Report | TVRM to buy Headquarters building

This entire issue of the NMRA eBulletin is dedicated to this mid-term update by President Charlie Getz. This column will also appear in its entirety in the December issue of NMRA Magazine.



First, the very merriest and satisfying of holiday seasons to each and every one of you. It is always a magical time to be a model railroader. In this column, I would like to report on the goals and promises made when I assumed office as your President. Under our revised regulations, I serve a three-year term. I began in the summer of 2012 and thus, this month marks my halfway point. In my first

column in the *NMRA Magazine*, I outlined five areas I hoped to emphasize: modernization, communication, integration, conformance and program/function reexamination. We have made significant progress in all areas although much remains to be done.

<u>Modernization.</u> How we do business is changing. The bylaws are slowly being redrafted to simplify and better define the distinction between our not-for-profit corporate side and our hobby association side. For too long that line has been blurred to the point that we define everything equally in ways that frankly are confusing and unnecessary. By the end of my term, I hope to complete this process. Further, I have used Special Assistants under my supervision on particular programs that do not fall within an existing Department. This provides flexibility and accountability.

Communication. Here we have made great strides thanks to Gerry Leone and his crew, Ben Sevier, Page Martin, Tom Draper and Stephen Priest. The Magazine continues to improve and thrive. The new NMRA eBulletin has been well received. The Infoblast continues to provide information to Regions. The Gallery Exhibit is entering its fabrication stage. Next month I will report on that exciting development in more detail. Our website is slowly improving and being revamped. As I write this, "Build A Memory" looks to be a success which we hope to expand. Indeed, our new Marketing Department has been stellar in promoting the NMRA. Alan Anderson continues his fundraising efforts on our behalf. And we have begun EduTRAIN®, our template for a program of clinics to assist Regions and divisions in educating members on a wide range of topics. Started by Jim Six of the Michiana division, Bob Blake is now overseeing this exciting new program.

Integration. This means that for US regions/division, tax-exempt status under our umbrella would be provided with a minimum of paperwork and with complete local control over finances and activities. We only await a final ruling from the IRS and clarification of the procedures to be used to launch this program. We will keep you informed as soon as we know.
