ROLLING TIME MACHINE

by Eugene Coffman In May of 2013, we visited the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum (TVRM) in Chattanooga. The museum is itself a chapter of the National Railway Historical Society and is primarily concerned with saving, restoring, and using steam locomotives. Southern Railway was integral in the founding (1960) and growth of the TVRM through continuing donations of land in East Chattanooga, the 900 ft. Missionary Ridge tunnel, freight and passenger cars, and several miles of abandoned rail line. Past and future growth of the TVRM is financed by donations and operation of the excursion trains. The museum operates the only regularly scheduled full sized steam

powered trains in the state.

Volunteers rebuilt the rail line through the Missionary Ridge tunnel and constructed a rail yard for the storage and repair of equipment in East Chattanooga. The museum began running a heritage railroad through the tunnel. These excursions were limited until the volunteers built the long needed bridge over Tunnel Blvd. in 1979. Mainline excursions were then possible to generate more income via the Southern Railway Steam Program.

The depots are reconstructions of small town stations of 80-90 years ago. A repair shop, an 80 ft. turntable, and other buildings were





added in East Chattanooga and the TVRM was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. These wonderful facilities originated with a core of volunteers who worked tirelessly and did much of the early restoration work themselves. The volunteers were later assisted by boiler makers and other trades brought in on contract as more money became available.

We had just arrived at the Grand Junction Station when we saw a full day excursion departing with Southern GP-30 #2594 leading the way. We bought tickets for the shorter round trip excursion to East Chattanooga and began exploring at Grand Junction. The red brick depot has a large waiting room, gift shop, and café open to the public. This location is also a good place to railfan as it is just off a heavily used Norfolk Southern track.

There are five storage tracks with steam and diesel engines and freight and passenger cars from most roads that have served Chattanooga in the past. All appear well cared for and are in a "preservation state". Serious repairs and rebuilding are done at the other end of the line at the East Chattanooga facility. The Grand Junction Station is actually inside a "wye" used to turn the trains at this location. About 30 minutes before our scheduled departure time, our train arrived, turned on the wye, and was ready for boarding on time.

Our excursion train was pulled by Southern Railway 630, a 2-8-0 built by ALCO in 1904 at their Richmond Works, which was

DA

This giant "Lazy Susan" was a requirement for steam-powered railroads, since a steam engine is basically a one-direction machine. Our turntable was built for the Central of Georgia roundhouse at Macon, Georgia, in 1916, by the American Bridge and Iron Company, in Ambridge, Pennsylvania.

With the advent of larger engines (this turntable is only 80 feet long), a long table was installed in Macon and this one was moved to Cedartown, Georgia, where it served until the Diesels came. It was given to Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum at Cedartown on an "as is" basis.

Considerable effort (and \$105,000.00) has relocated this rebuilt and vital antique for our use and your enjoyment. It was placed in Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum service on July 4, 1982.

restored over a ten year period at the TVRM. This process was one of the most extensive steam locomotive restorations since the end of the steam era on the railroads. The cars were restored pre-1930 heavyweights that were spartan but roomy, clean, and nicely painted. The cars were 70% full on our departure. The TVRM reminded us that they are not just restoring equipment, but are restoring the steam experience. Another passenger was heard to remark that he felt like he was in a "rolling time machine".

Our three mile ride crossed four bridges with one spanning the Chickamauga River and went through the 900' Missionary Ridge tunnel on our way to the East Chattanooga facility. The tunnel was completed in 1858 by the East Tennessee & Georgia RR as part of their Chattanooga branch. The tunnel is itself on the National Register of Historic Places. It is a so-called "horseshoe tunnel" as it is slightly wider at the top than at the bottom in the style of many European tunnels. As RR equipment became larger and the single track tunnel became a bottleneck on the two track Southern RR system, the tunnel was abandoned.

When we reached East Chattanooga, locomotive #630 and its tender were uncoupled and proceeded immediately to the turntable where we watched as it was turned for




the return trip. The turntable bridge was at track height where the engine drives onto it and the other end was about 4" higher than the opposite track. The engine must be almost exactly centered to minimize friction for the electric motor to rotate the bridge but slightly forward of center to cause the bridge to tip to put the head end of the bridge level with the opposite track. The engineer must



pull onto the bridge and stop at the exact spot to satisfy both requirements. It is considered a mark of an experienced steam engineer that he can do this on the first try; ours did. The rotation then stopped on a dime and 630 rolled off to rejoin our train.

We then toured the large modern restoration and repair shop where a steam locomotive was being disassembled and two passenger cars were in work. Due to the work actually in progress (on a Saturday) and a 10ton overhead crane in use, our access was quite limited for safety's sake. Also in view was a wheel lathe "truing" a driver wheel to a tolerance of 0.001 in. We then had a walking tour of the storage yard where two more GP's and a wide variety of cars awaited their turn in the shop.

Our return trip to Grand Junction on the same route was enjoyable and uneventful. Although the TVRM has long run short excursion trains, they have added halfand full day excursions to destinations in Tennessee and Georgia, and for special themes throughout the year such as "A Day Out with Thomas", North Pole Limited, and the New Years Eve Dinner Train. An unexpected feature of the Tennessee Valley Railway is that it also handles freight as there is one industry, Allied Metals, on the Chattanooga branch's track and it also performs switching duties at a nearby industrial park where the Volkswagen Assembly Plant is located. Looking to the future, there is another Consolida-





A few words from the President Midterm Progress Report / TVRM to buy Headquarters building

First, the very merriest and satisfying of holiday seasons to each and every one of you. It is always a magical time to be a model railroader. In this column, I would like to report on the goals and promises made when I assumed office as your President. Under our revised regulations, I serve a three-year term. <u>Communication.</u> Here we have made great strides thanks to Gerry Leone and his crew, Ben Sevier, Page Martin, Tom Draper and Stephen Priest. The Magazine continues to improve and thrive. The new *NMRA eBulletin* has been well received. The Infoblast continues to provide information to Regions. The Gallery Exhibit is entering its fabrication stage. Next month I will report on that exciting development in more detail. Our website is slowly improving and being revamped. As I write this, "Build A Memory" looks to be a success which we hope to expand. Indeed, our new Marketing Department has been stellar in promoting the NMRA. Alan Anderson continues his fundraising efforts on our behalf. And we have begun EduTRAIN®, our template for a program of clinics to assist Regions and divisions in educating members on a wide range of topics. 
